Many Philippine churches today welcome pets and animals for special blessing on them. It is interesting to see the blessing ceremony of these pets during or after the masses. Several catholic 'masters' of the pets happened to be in the church today just for the sake of their dearly pets and domestics! The compassion and love for God's creation reflected in the charismatic personality of saint Francis of Assisi is re-lived by inviting all creations to the 'temple' of the Lord!

Gospel presents Jesus praising the people of Tyre and Sidon just because of their readiness to repent. Jesus acknowledges their good deeds.
